


STUDENT WRITING CELEBRATIONS





Provide fun paper or fun pens for students to write their final draft on. Display on a bulletin board or put them in a binder to be stored in a classroom library for student access during independent reading time.

 Students earn a piece of a classroom photo, collaborative project, or earn simple construction paper cutouts to reinforce their learning.

Students use colored pens to publish a final piece.





Use Technology:

- Create an e-book to be shared with families using Power Point, Google Docs, etc.
- Students record themselves reading their story with fun voices or as the author.
- Create an online resource where students can share and store their work. Students should be encouraged to comment on other's work.



Share with others:

Host a publishing party- create invitations and invite classes or the student's adult(s).

- Coffee Shop theme or Reader's Theater.
- Have students video themselves reading and have a viewing party with popcorn!





Extrinsic Energy:

- Students use colored pens (to keep) for publishing.
- A book of published work for the class (online resource).
- Read outside then extra recess.
- Stickers on personal goal setting trackers.



Class Party:

- Have a classroom camp out- create tents on student desks, mimic a campsite, or kids bring sleeping bags.
- Have a pajama party! Students bring a stuffed animal to read to, a blanket and wear their pajamas.
- Flashlight reading!
- Create an Author's Share Chair and provide an opportunity for weekly reader share-out.
